In an interview for The Verge magazine, Zuckerberg made it clear that his metaverse has a distinct worldview

on the fingers for “hate speech,” several months’ exile from Meta for violation of “community standards.”

Add to the above assiduous “fact-checking” on sermon content and a close examination of biblical texts that are “missing context.” Leaders may be pressured to better reflect community social values and “equality” as well as to remedy “gender imbalance” and “racism.” . . .

Churches charmed by the opportunity to be a player in the metaverse, with all the advantages it offers, display a forgetfulness of the matrix known as the Kingdom of God.

They also reveal a forgetfulness of the lesson attendant to the temptation of Christ, who was offered the kingdoms of the world if he would bow down and worship the Devil. Denominations must resist the lure of the metaverse, which falsely promises enormous opportunities for wealth, evangelism, and innovation in exchange for worshipping other gods.

Churches may think they have much to gain by joining the kingdom of Meta, but they actually may be in danger of losing their souls.

Did you catch the deadly implications of all of this? Churches are willingly subjecting themselves to the same oversight and censorship that Big Tech practices every day. Wow. What did I expect of these last days? This very thing!




